Admissions Policy

The Division of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies (Doctoral Course), Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies aim is to nurture students who will be university faculty, researchers and highly specialized professionals with fertile creativity in the future who can be active in the multidisciplinary research fields of the human and social environment.

This division thus seeks individuals who have not only high professional skills in each traditional field of study but also the followings in order to further advance cutting-edge research from perspectives that make use of comprehensiveness while being based on such expertise: an open attitude towards others, an open mind respectful of other cultures, a positive interest in them, a flexible mindset for unknown phenomena, and a strong orientation toward logical thinking.

At the time of enrollment, they are thus required to have abilities to formulate research themes and carry out the research steadily, research techniques that enable steady results, and skills to compile the results, analyze and consider them, and write them into a dissertation.

5. Application requirements

Applicants must qualify for any of the categories listed below (1)-(8).

In the following selection, in addition to the above, it is necessary to satisfy the following application qualifications.

Professional special selection: Persons who qualify for (A) or (B)

- (A) A person who works at a government office, company, office, organization, school, etc., and aims to perform their doctoral studies while working

- (B) A person with a master’s degree or professional degree that was obtained three or more years before the time of enrollment

International student special selection: Persons who do not have Japanese citizenship

Application requirements (General selection, Professional special selection, International student special selection)	
(1)	A person who has a master’s degree or a professional degree or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2020
(2)	A person who has been granted a master’s degree or a professional degree in a foreign country or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2020
(3)	A person who has completed a program of an educational institution while living in Japan which is recognized by his or her country as having a curriculum of a graduate school under the said country’s education system and which is designated separately by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and who has been granted a degree equivalent to a master’s degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2020
(4)	A person who has completed course subjects offered through a distance learning system by a foreign school while living in Japan and has been granted a degree equivalent to a master’s degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2020
(5)	Those who have completed a program at the United Nations University, which was established pursuant to a resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on December 11th, 1972, and is prescribed in Article 1, Paragraph 2 of the Act on Special Measures Incidental to Enforcement of the “Agreement between the United Nations and Japan regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations University” (Act No. 72 of 1976) (Hereinafter referred to as the “United Nations University”), and has been conferred a degree equivalent to a master’s degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2020
(6)	Persons designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (September 1st, 1989 Ministry of Education Public Notice No. 118)

Persons who:

* after graduating from a university, completing a sixteen year curriculum at a school in a foreign country, or completing a foreign country's sixteen year curriculum by taking courses that are part of distance education administered by the foreign country's school,

* have engaged in research for two or more years at a university, research institute, etc.,

* and, based on these research results, etc., are recognized by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies as having academic abilities the same as or greater than persons holding a master's degree or professional degree

(7) A person who will reach 24 years of age by September 30th, 2020 and is recognized as having academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree or a professional degree as a result of individual screening by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies

(8) Persons who have taken educational program by a school in a foreign country, an educational institution with a designation under Item 3, or the United Nations University and who has passed tests and examination prescribed in Article 16, Paragraph 2 of the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools or is expected to do so by September 30th, 2020, and who is recognized by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies to have an academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree

Application qualification screening

Persons who wish to apply based on application qualification (6)-(8) will undergo an application qualification screening before they submit their application. Please contact the school first and then submit, to the Admission Section (Student Affairs Division, Human and Social Administration Department), the materials listed in “6. Application procedures” (excluding the proof of examination fee bank transfer payment) so that they arrive by 5:00 pm on Fri., May 22nd, 2020.

If sending materials by postal mail, please write the following in red on the envelope: “Doctoral Application Qualification Screening Materials.”

The results of the application qualification screening will be sent in early June. If you have qualifications, those submitted materials at the time of application qualification screening

will be accepted as the application materials. As an application procedure, they should pay the examination fee and submit the designated proof of examination fee bank transfer payment to the Admission Section (Student Affairs Division, Human and Social Administration Department) during the application period.

7. Examination slip issuance

8. Individuals with disabilities, etc.

Applicants who require accommodations when taking the entrance examination or when studying at the university due to disabilities or for other reasons should submit the following materials to and consult with the Admission Section (Student Affairs Division, Human and Social Administration Department) before the admission period (by Fri., May 22nd, 2020).

- (1) A “Prior Consultation Document for Application” that includes the following information (format unspecified):
 - Name, address, contact information, name of desired course,
 - Disability type and degree,
 - Desired entrance examination/studying accommodations,
 - Correspondence at previous university, etc.,
 - Daily life situation, and
 - Other relevant information.
- (2) Medical certificate written by a doctor
- (3) Other reference materials (disability identification booklet copy, etc.)

9. Applicant selection method

General selection, professional special selection, and international student special selection

Selection will be carried out based on the results of the screening (oral examination, research plan, submitted articles, etc. and application materials).

The oral examination will focus on the master’s thesis (or article abstract, research article, survey/research report, etc.) and research plan.

Applicants may be asked about their abilities in foreign languages that are needed for research.

Professional special selection applicants may also be asked about the specialized knowledge they gained from their professional experience.

International student special selection applicants may be asked about Japanese language abilities in the case that such abilities are needed in their research.

10. Examination location

Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies, Kanazawa University, Kakuma-machi, Kanazawa-shi, Ishikawa (Details will be sent along with the examination slip.)

11. Admission procedures

(1) Admission procedures

Please enroll by the specified date using the “Procedural Guidelines for Graduate School Admission” that will be sent after successful applicants are announced.

Successful applicants will be required to submit a bank account balance certificate (balance of 1 million yen or more). (To apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE))

(2) Payment of tuition and other fees

(a) Admission fee: ¥282,000

The following individuals do not need to pay the admission fee: individuals who, after completing a Kanazawa University graduate school master’s course, will directly enroll in the doctoral course, and the Japanese government scholarship international students.

(b) Tuition (semester[a half year]): ¥267,900 (year total: ¥535,800)

(Notes)

1. The above prices are tentative. If the amount of admission fee or tuition is changed before or after enrollment, the new price will be applied.
2. Tuition is paid via direct debit. It will be automatically deducted from the bank account specified by the student on the specified date.
3. The Japanese government scholarship international students do not pay tuition.

(c) Personal accident insurance for students pursuing education and research (PAS) and Liability Insurance coupled with PAS: ¥3,620 (three years)

International students are strongly recommended to buy Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with "Gakkensai" (*Inbound futai-gakusō* インバウンド付帯学総)

12. Protection of personal information

Kanazawa University has established regulations on personal information management to properly manage and protect the information it holds.

All personal information that the University obtained during the candidate selection process and all personal information included in the documents submitted as in the enrollment process will be used for the following purposes:

- (1) Operations related to candidate selection and enrollment
- (2) Operations related to enrollment management, study instructions, and health management such as medical examinations after admission
- (3) Operations related to on-campus services such as the University's portal site, campus LAN, library, and borrowing library books after enrollment
- (4) Operations related to academic support, such as entrance-fee waivers, tuition waivers, and the selection of scholarship recipients
- (5) Operations related to the payment of entrance fees, tuition, and the operations of the financial institution to which the University outsources payment collection
- (6) Investigation and research related to candidate selection conducted in such a way that no particular individuals can be identified
- (7) Operations related to PR targeting students and their families, and related to fund (donation)
- (8) Operations related to outcome assessments for the graduates and those related to alumni relations, and the information services through Kanazawa University
- (9) Statistical work conducted in such a way that no particular individuals can be identified

Long-term enrollment system

- **Students can take courses while continuing to manage other life responsibilities.** (This is not applicable for those status of residence is student.)

The Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies offers a long-term enrollment system for people with other responsibilities such as full-time work, housework, child-rearing, nursing for family members, and so on. Through this system, the student's enrollment period can be extended within the limit set in the school's regulations (generally six years at the doctoral course). This provides diverse and flexible learning opportunities for professionals' and others' academic needs.

Tuition is the same as the standard course of study (doctoral course section: three years) and can be paid in parts while enrolled.

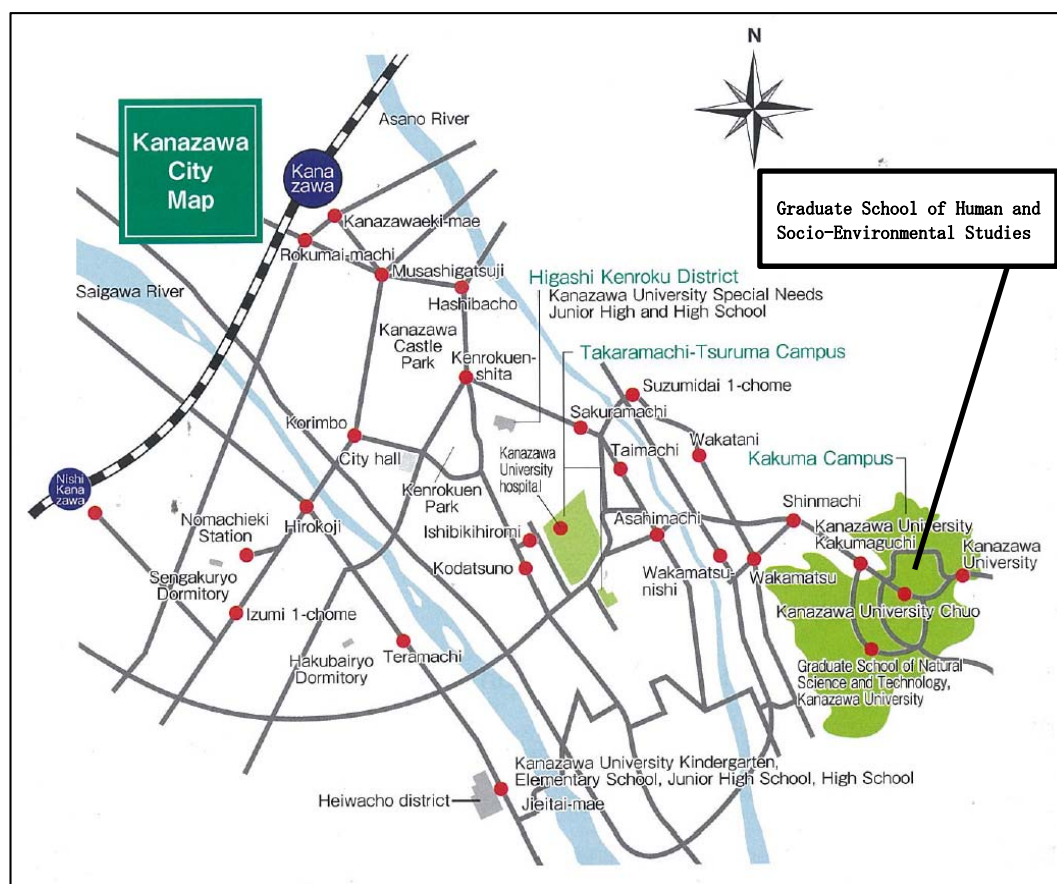
