Admissions Policy

The Division of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies (Doctoral Course), Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies aim is to nurture students who will be university faculty, researchers and highly specialized professionals with fertile creativity in the future who can be active in the multidisciplinary research fields of the human and social environment.

This division thus seeks individuals who have not only high professional skills in each traditional field of study but also the followings in order to further advance cutting-edge research from perspectives that make use of comprehensiveness while being based on such expertise: an open attitude towards others, an open mind respectful of other cultures, a positive interest in them, a flexible mindset for unknown phenomena, and a strong orientation toward logical thinking.

At the time of enrollment, they are thus required to have abilities to formulate research themes and carry out the research steadily, research techniques that enable steady results, and skills to compile the results, analyze and consider them, and write them into a dissertation.

2. Application qualifications

Applicants must qualify for any of the categories listed below (1)-(8).

In the following selection, in addition to the above, it is necessary to satisfy the following application qualifications.

Special selection for working professionals: Persons who qualify for (A) or (B)

- (A) A person who works at a government office, company, office, organization, school, etc., and aims to perform their doctoral studies while working
- (B) A person who has a master's degree or professional degree and has working experience before the time of enrollment

Special selection for international students: Persons who do not have Japanese citizenship

Application qualifications

(General selection, Special selection for working professionals, Special selection for international students)

- (1) A person who has a master's degree or a professional degree or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2022
- (2) A person who has been granted a master's degree or a professional degree in a foreign country or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2022
- (3) A person who has completed a program of an educational institution while living in Japan which is recognized by his or her country as having a curriculum of a graduate school under the said country's education system and which is designated separately by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and who has been granted a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2022
- (4) A person who has completed course subjects offered through a distance learning system by a foreign school while living in Japan and has been granted a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2022
- (5) Those who have completed a program at the United Nations University, which was established pursuant to a resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on December 11th, 1972, and is prescribed in Article 1, Paragraph 2 of the Act on Special Measures Incidental to Enforcement of the "Agreement between the United Nations and Japan regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations University" (Act No. 72 of 1976)
 - (Hereinafter referred to as the "United Nations University"), and has been conferred a degree equivalent to a master's degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2022
- (6) Persons designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (September 1st, 1989 Ministry of Education Public Notice No. 118)

 Persons who:
 - * after graduating from a university, completing a sixteen year curriculum at a school in a foreign country, or completing a foreign country's sixteen year curriculum by taking courses that are part of distance education administered by the foreign country's school,
 - * have engaged in research for two or more years at a university, research institute, etc.,
 - * and, based on these research results, etc., are recognized by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies as having academic abilities the same as or greater than persons holding a master's degree or professional degree

- (7) A person who will reach 24 years of age by September 30th, 2022, and is recognized as having academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree or a professional degree as a result of individual screening by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies
- (8) Persons who have taken educational program by a school in a foreign country, an educational institution with a designation under Item 3, or the United Nations University and who has passed tests and examination prescribed in Article 16, Paragraph 2 of the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools or is expected to do so by September 30th, 2022, and who is recognized by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies to have an academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree

Application qualification screening

Persons who wish to apply based on application qualification (6)-(8) will undergo an application qualification screening before they submit their application. Please contact the Admission Section (Student Affairs Division, Human and Social Administration Department (hereinafter referred to as "the Admission Section")) first and then submit the materials listed in "3. Application method" (excluding the Application confirmation slip [出願確認票 for submission] and the Address label) to the Admission Section, so that they arrive by 5:00 pm on Fri., May 13th, 2022.

If sending materials by postal mail, please write the following in red on the envelope: "Doctoral Application Qualification Screening Materials".

The results of the application qualification screening will be sent in early-June. If you are qualified, those submitted materials at the time of application qualification screening will be accepted as the application materials. Please follow "3. Application method" to register your information, pay the admission examination fee and upload an ID photo, and then submit the "Application confirmation slip (出願確認票 for submission)" to the Admission Section during the application period.

2 Payment method

Any of the following methods can be used: Credit card (VISA, MasterCard, JCB, AMERICAN EXPRESS, Diners Club), convenience stores in Japan, bank ATMs in Japan (payment via Pay-easy) and net banking with Japanese banks (PayPay Bank and Seven Bank cannot be used)

5. Applicant selection method

General selection, special selection for working professionals, and special selection for international students

Selection will be carried out based on the results of the screening (oral examination, research plan, submitted articles, etc. and application materials).

The oral examination will focus on the master's thesis (or article abstract, research article, survey/research report, etc.) and research plan.

Applicants may be asked about their abilities in foreign languages that are needed for research.

Applicants of special selection for working professionals may also be asked about the specialized knowledge they gained from their professional experience.

Applicants of special selection for international students may be asked about Japanese language abilities in the case that such abilities are needed in their research.

9. Admission procedures

(1) Admission procedures

Please complete the procedures by the deadline by using the "Procedural Guidelines

for Graduate School Admission" that will be sent after successful applicants are announced.

Successful applicants who reside outside Japan will be required to submit a bank account balance certificate (balance of 1 million yen or more). (To apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE))

(2) Payment of tuition and other fees

(a) Admission fee: JPY 282,000

The following individuals do not need to pay the admission fee: individuals who will directly enroll in the doctoral course just after completing a Kanazawa University graduate school master's course, and the Japanese government scholarship international students.

- (b) Tuition (semester [a half year]): JPY 267,900 (year total: JPY 535,800) (Notes)
 - 1. The above prices are tentative. If the amount of admission fee or tuition is changed before or after enrollment, the new price will be applied.
 - 2. Tuition is paid via direct debit. It will be automatically deducted from the bank account specified by the student on the specified date.
 - 3. The Japanese government scholarship international students do not need to pay tuition.
- (c) Personal accident insurance for students pursuing education and research (PAS) and Liability Insurance coupled with PAS: JPY 3,620 (for three years)

International students are strongly recommended to buy Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with "Gakkensai" (*Inbound futai-gakus*ŏ インバウンド付帯学総)

10. About taking external English examination

English proficiency testing fee (self-pay)

- * As a rule of the graduate school, all doctoral course students are required to take an external English examination and obtain the prescribed score after admission.
- * However, those who fall under any of the followings are waived from taking such English test. For that, you need to submit the "Application Form for English Examination Waiver" and be examined.
 - ①Those who have a score of TOEIC (L&R) 760, TOEFL-iBT 80, TOEFL-ITP 550 or IELTS 6.0 or higher
 - Those who entered this graduate school by special selection for working professionals

- ③Native English speakers (those who was born and raised in a country where English is the official language and acquired English as the first language)
- ④Others specifically approved by the Dean of the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies
- * We might cover a part or all of the testing fee by using various subsidy systems in Kanazawa University.

11. Individuals with disabilities, etc.

Applicants who require consideration when taking the entrance examination or when studying at the university due to disabilities or for other reasons should submit the following materials to and consult with the Admission Section before the application period (by Fri., May 13th, 2022).

(2) Project for Remarkable Ph.D. Students in Next Generation

Kanazawa University expects selected Doctoral Course students to develop their qualification and abilities as remarkable Ph.D. students, drive into unknown territory, lead the development of science and technology, then contribute to solutions of social issues in

Japan.

Students who have passed the screening will be provided various supports as below.

Financial supports shall apply only for the duration of the term of study specified in the Rules of the Graduate Schools.

- 1. Grant for living expenses JPY 180,000 / month
- 2. Grant for research expenses JPY 400,000 / year
- ♦ Admission and Tuition Fees Waiver

There is a possibility that those amounts and conditions will be changed in each year.

Students who are receiving salary, scholarship, etc. which are enough as living expenses (JPY 2,400,000 and more/year) are not eligible to apply for this project. Since Kanazawa University sets application requirements, please contact the administrative office for the details.

13. Protection of personal information

Kanazawa University has established regulations on personal information management to properly manage and protect the information it holds.

Long-term enrollment system

■ Students can take courses while continuing to manage other life responsibilities. (This is not applicable for international students whose status of residence is student.)

The Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies offers a long-term enrollment system for people with other responsibilities such as full-time work, housework,

child-rearing, nursing for family members, and so on. Through this system, the student's enrollment period can be extended within the limit set in the school's regulations (generally six years at the doctoral course). This provides diverse and flexible learning opportunities for professionals' and others' academic needs.

Total tuition amount is the same as that of standard course of study (doctoral course section: three years) and can be paid in parts while enrolled.

15. Applicants affected by natural disasters

Kanazawa University waives the admission examination fee for applicants suffered from natural disasters in order to reduce their economic burden and ensure that they have an opportunity to study at the university.


