1 Admissions Policy

The Division of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies (Doctoral Course), Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies aim is to nurture students who will be university faculty, researchers and highly specialized professionals with fertile creativity in the future who can be active in the multidisciplinary research fields of the human and social environment.

This division thus seeks individuals who have not only high professional skills in each traditional field of study but also the followings in order to further advance cutting-edge research from perspectives that make use of comprehensiveness while being based on such expertise: an open attitude towards others, an open mind respectful of other cultures, a positive interest in them, a flexible mindset for unknown phenomena, and a strong orientation toward logical thinking.

At the time of enrollment, they are thus required to have abilities to formulate research themes and carry out the research steadily, research techniques that enable steady results, and skills to compile the results, analyze and consider them, and write them into a dissertation.

3 Application Qualifications

Applicants must qualify for any of the categories listed below (1)-(8).

In the following selection, in addition to the above, it is necessary to satisfy the following application qualifications.

Special selection for working adults: <u>Persons who qualify for (A) or (B)</u>

- (A) A person who works at a company, etc., and aims to perform their doctoral studies while working
- (B) A person who has a master's degree or professional degree and has working experience before the time of enrollment

Special selection for international students: Persons who do not have Japanese citizenship

Application qualifications (General selection, Special selection for working adults, Special selection for international students)

 A person who has a master's degree or a professional degree or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2024

- (2) A person who has been granted a master's degree or a professional degree in a foreign country or who is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2024
- (3) A person who has completed a program of an educational institution while living in Japan which is recognized by his or her country as having a curriculum of a graduate school under the said country's education system and which is designated separately by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and who has been granted a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2024
- (4) A person who has completed course subjects offered through a distance learning system by a foreign school while living in Japan and has been granted a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2024
- (5) Those who have completed a program at the United Nations University, which was established pursuant to a resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on December 11th, 1972, and is prescribed in Article 1, Paragraph 2 of the Act on Special Measures Incidental to Enforcement of the "Agreement between the United Nations and Japan regarding the Headquarters of the United Nations University" (Act No. 72 of 1976)

 (Hereinafter referred to as the "United Nations University"), and has been conferred a degree equivalent to a master's degree or is expected to acquire one by September 30th, 2024
- (6) Persons designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (September 1st, 1989 Ministry of Education Public Notice No. 118)
 - 1) Those who have graduated from a university and have been engaged in research at a university or research institute for two years or more, and who are recognized by the Graduate School as having academic ability equivalent or superior to a person with a master's degree, based on the results of said research.
 - 2) Those who have completed 16 years of formal education in a foreign country or 16 years of correspondence courses in a foreign country, and who have been engaged in research at a university or research institute for 2 years or more, and who are recognized by the Graduate School as having academic ability equivalent to a master's degree.
- (7) A person who will reach 24 years of age by September 30th, 2024, and is recognized as having academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree or a professional degree as a result of individual screening by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies
- (8) Persons who have taken educational program by a school in a foreign country, an educational institution with a designation under Item 3, or the United Nations University and who has passed tests and examination prescribed in Article 16, Paragraph 2 of the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools or is expected to do so by September 30th, 2024, and who is recognized by the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies to have an academic ability equivalent to or more of that of persons having a master's degree
- * Applicants wishing to apply based on application qualification (6),(7),(8) will undergo an application qualification screening before they submit their application. Please refer to the following **Application qualification screening**.

To all those who wish to advance from the Master's Level Section of the Integrated Course to the Doctoral Course or the Doctoral Level Section of the Integrated Course at Kanazawa University.

At Kanazawa University, students who wish to advance from the Master's Level Section of the Integrated Course to the Doctoral Course or the Doctoral Level Section of the Integrated Course generally required to complete the "Qualifying Examination" (referred to as "QE" hereafter).

Students who pass the QE are not restricted to writing a master's thesis but can proceed with their research toward a doctoral dissertation at an early stage. Students who wish to take the QE examination should check with their Students Affairs Section for information on the QE examination procedures before applying.

4 Application Qualification Screening

Persons who wish to apply based on application qualification (6), (7), (8) will undergo an application qualification screening before they submit their application. Please contact the Admission Section (Contact information listed in 16.) first and then submit the materials listed in "6 Application method" (excluding the Application confirmation slip [出願確認票 for submission] and the Address label) to the Admission Section, so that they arrive by 5:00 pm on Mon. May 13th, 2024.

If sending materials by postal mail, please write the following in red on the envelope: "Doctoral Application Qualification Screening Materials".

The results of the application qualification screening will be sent in late-May. If you are qualified, those submitted materials at the time of application qualification screening will be accepted as the application materials. Please follow "6. Application method" to register your information, pay the admission examination fee and upload an ID photo, and then submit the "Application confirmation slip (出願確認票 for submission)" to the Admission Section during the application period.

2 Payment method

Any of the following methods can be used: Credit card (VISA, MasterCard, JCB, AMERICAN EXPRESS, Diners Club), convenience stores in Japan, bank ATMs in Japan (payment via Pay-easy) and net banking with Japanese banks (PayPay Bank and Seven Bank cannot be used)

- (Note) 1. When payment is completed, application information may not be revised. Before completing payment, make sure to check that there are no errors in the application information (particularly e-mail addresses and phone numbers).
 - 2. Payment is not accepted at bank teller windows.

- 3. Payment using bank ATMs in convenience stores is not acceptable.
- 4. A credit card or bank account held by somebody other than the applicant may be used for payment.
- 5. After the application documents are accepted, the admission examination fee will not be returned for any reason. 8 Applicant Selection Method

(1) Selection Classification

General selection, special selection for working adults, and special selection for international students

(2) Selection Method

Selection will be carried out based on the results of the screening (oral examination, research plan, submitted articles, etc. and application materials).

Applicants for the special selection for Qualifying Examination (QE) will be notified separately.

(3) Oral examination

The oral examination will focus on the master's thesis (or article abstract, research article, survey/research report, etc.) and research plan. Applicants may be asked about their abilities in foreign languages that are needed for research.

In the special selection for working adults, we will positively evaluate the specialized knowledge based on your working experience.

In principle, the special selection for international students will be conducted in English. If necessary for research purposes, the applicant may also be asked the Japanese language proficiency.





- (2) Tuition (semester [a half year]): 267,900 yen (tentative) (year total: 535,800 yen (tentative)) (Notes)
- ① The above prices are tentative. If the amount of admission fee or tuition is changed before or after enrollment, the new price will be applied.
- ② Tuition is paid via direct debit. It will be automatically deducted from the bank account specified by the student on the specified date.
- ③ The Japanese government scholarship international students do not need to pay tuition.

13 Others

- (1) English proficiency test
 - * As a rule of the graduate school, all doctoral course students are required to take an external English examination and obtain the prescribed score after enrollment.
 - * However, those who fall under any of the followings are waived from taking such English test. For that, you need to submit the "Application Form for English Examination Waiver" and be examined.
- ① Those who have a score of TOEIC (L&R) 760, TOEFL-iBT 80, TOEFL-ITP 550 or IELTS 6.0 or higher
- 2 Those who entered this graduate school by special selection for working adults
- ③ Native English speakers (those who was born and raised in a country where English is the official language and acquired English as the first language)
- ④ Those who has graduated from a university or other institution of higher education in a country where English is the official language, even though English is not his/her native language.
- ⑤ Others specifically approved by the Dean of the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies
- (2) Regarding the "Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools Article 14-based Educational Methods Special Case" System (Day/evening course system)

This system is applicable at the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies. It may be used by persons who are working and some others. Through this system, such persons can, with the permission and under the guidance of their supervisor, flexibly engage in their studies based on the educational curriculum prescribed in regulations, etc. of the Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies.

Reference: Excerpt from "Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools" (1974, Ministry of Education Order No. 28)

Article 14. In graduate school courses, if educationally necessary, education can be carried out based on suitable methods in which, for example, classes or research guidance are carried out at night or other specified times or periods.

The Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies does not fall under Article 2.2 (Graduate Schools Courses Carrying out Education Solely at Night).

(3) Long-term enrollment system

The Graduate School of Human and Socio-Environmental Studies offers a long-term enrollment system for people with other responsibilities such as full-time work, housework, child-rearing, nursing for family members, and so on. If you wish to apply, please put a ☑ in the "Long-term Enrollment System Preference" box on the application form.

Through this system, the student's enrollment period can be extended within the limit set in the Graduate School Rules (generally six years at the doctoral course). This provides diverse and flexible learning opportunities for professionals' and others' academic needs.

Total tuition amount is the same as that of standard course of study (doctoral course section: three years) and can be paid in parts while enrolled.

Eligible students must fall into one of the following categories and have difficulty completing their studies within the standard working years.

- (a) Those who are gainfully employed (including temporary employment)
- (b) Those who are engaged in housework, childcare, nursing care, etc.
- (c) Those who have physical disabilities, intellectual disabilities, mental disabilities (including developmental disabilities), or other physical or mental functional disabilities. Persons with physical disabilities, intellectual disabilities, mental disabilities (including developmental disabilities), or other physical or mental functional disabilities.

(4) Individuals with disabilities, etc.

Applicants who require consideration when taking the entrance examination or when studying at the university due to disabilities or for other reasons should submit the following materials to and consult with the Admission Section (Contact information listed in 16) before the deadline for submission of documents of application qualification screening

- ① A "Prior Consultation Document for Application" that includes the following information (format unspecified):
 - · Name, address, contact information, name of desired course,
 - Disability type and degree,
 - · Matters for which consideration is required for entrance examination and study after enrollment,
 - · Correspondence at previous university, etc.,
 - · Daily life situation, and
 - · Other relevant information.
- ② Medical certificate written by a doctor (a copy is acceptable)
- ③ Other reference materials (disability identification booklet copy, etc.)

14 Protection of Personal Information

Kanazawa University has established regulations on personal information management to properly manage and protect the information it holds.

All personal information that the University obtained during the candidate selection process and all personal information included in the documents submitted as in the enrollment process will be used for the following purposes:

- (1) Operations related to candidate selection and enrollment
- (2) Operations related to enrollment management, study instructions, and health management such as medical examinations after admission
- (3) Operations related to on-campus services such as the University's portal site, campus LAN, library, and borrowing library books after enrollment
- (4) Operations related to academic support, such as entrance-fee waivers, tuition waivers, and the selection of scholarship recipients
- (5) Operations related to the payment of admission fees, tuition, and the operations of the financial institution to which the University outsources payment collection
- (6) Investigation and research related to candidate selection conducted in such a way that no particular individuals can be identified
- (7) Operations related to PR targeting students and their families, and related to fund (donation)
- (8) Operations related to outcome assessments for the graduates and those related to alumni relations, and the information services through Kanazawa University
- (9) Statistical work conducted in such a way that no particular individuals can be identified


